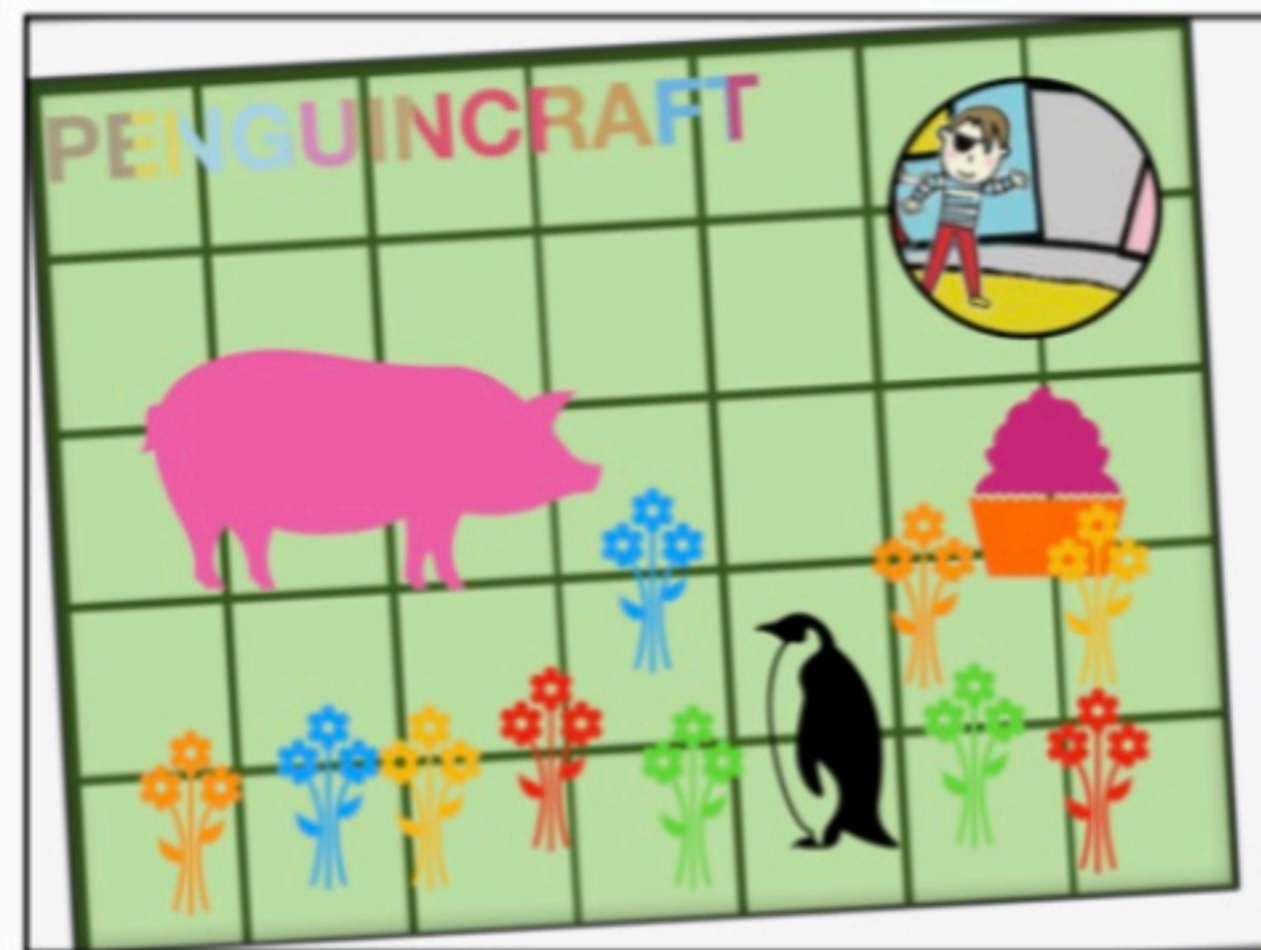

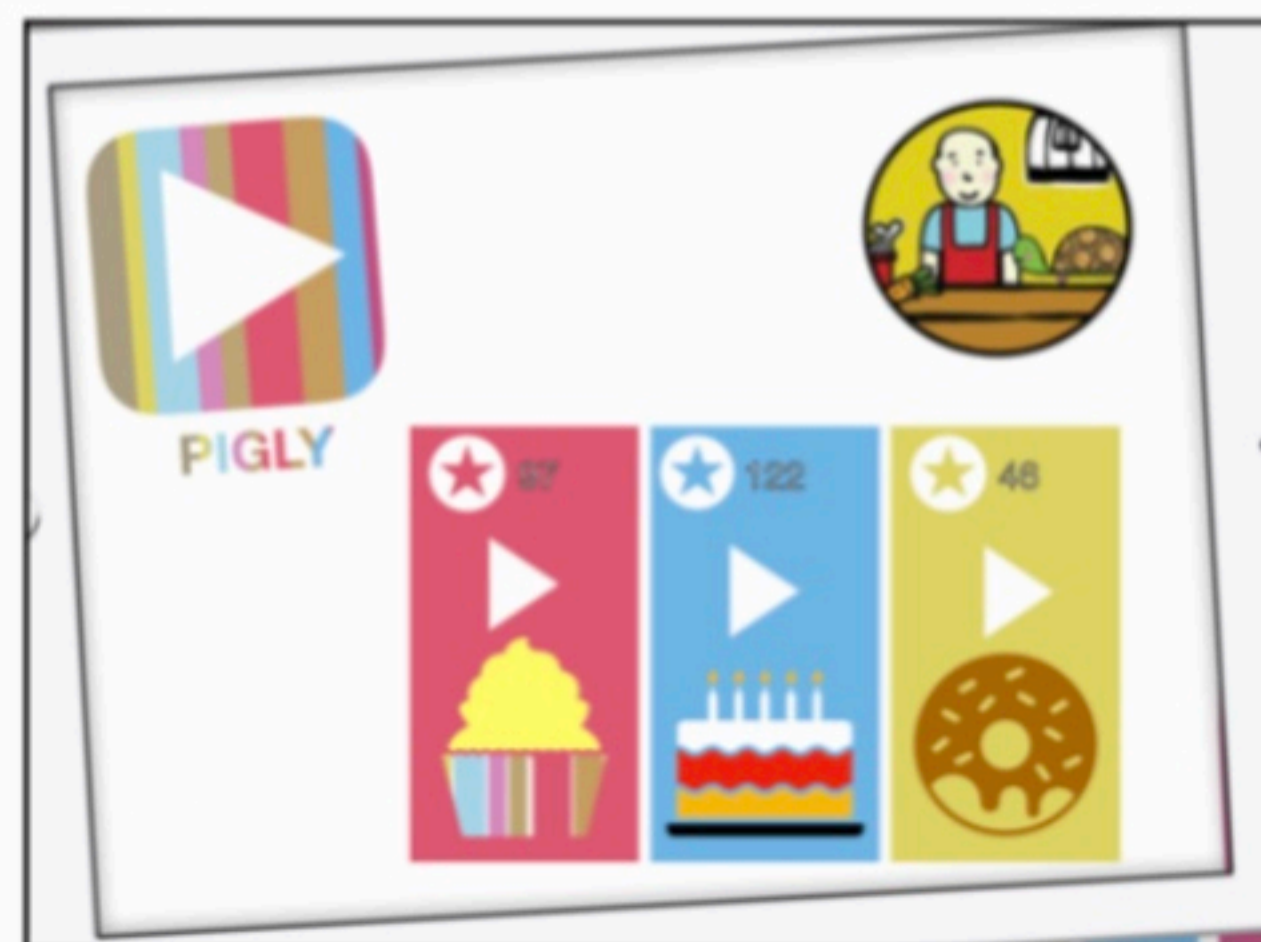


Strong passwords need to be memorable but not personal.

Looking at predictable passwords and creating new passwords of layered, random words will demonstrate how to set memorable but impersonal passwords.

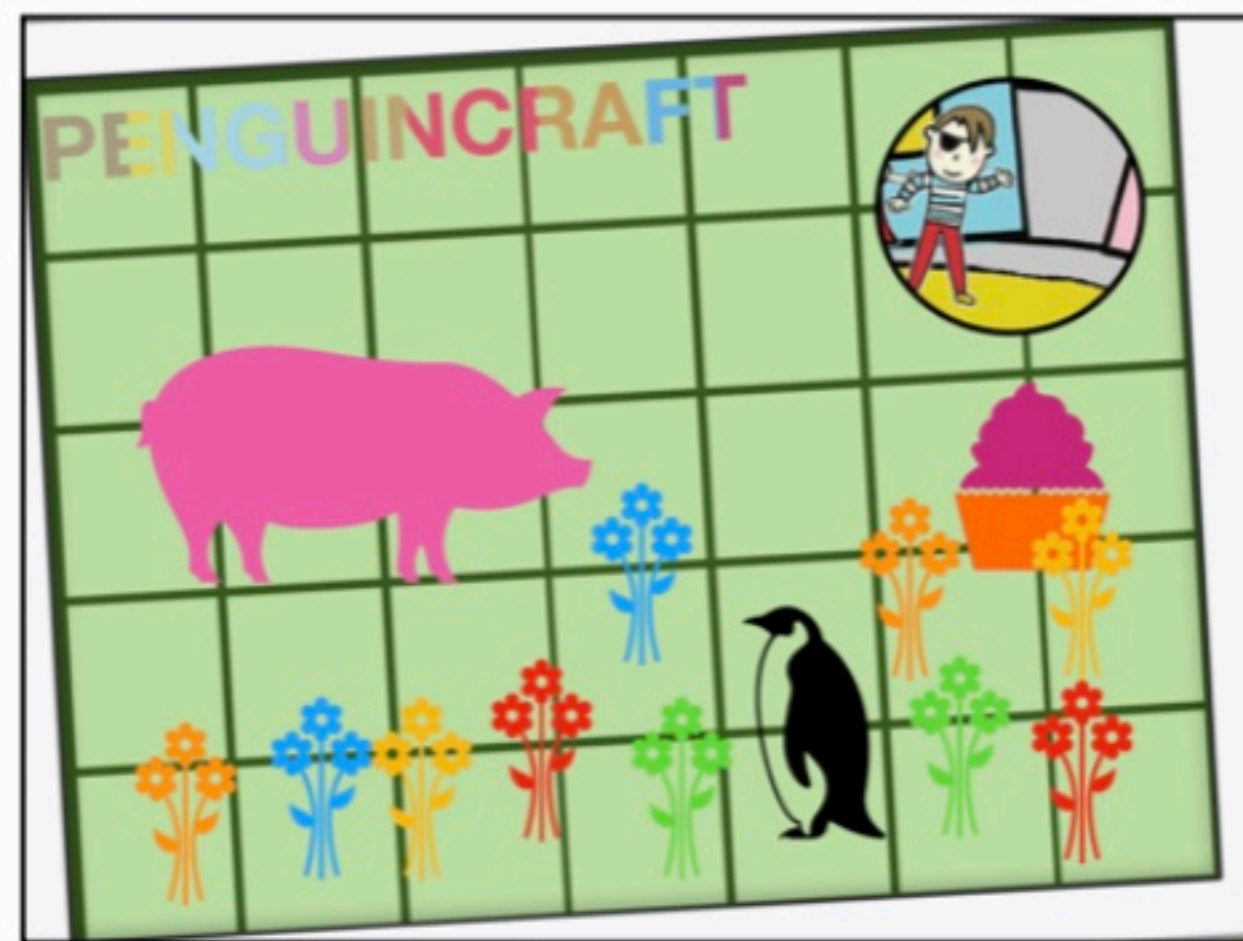

3. PIGLY: for watching videos.

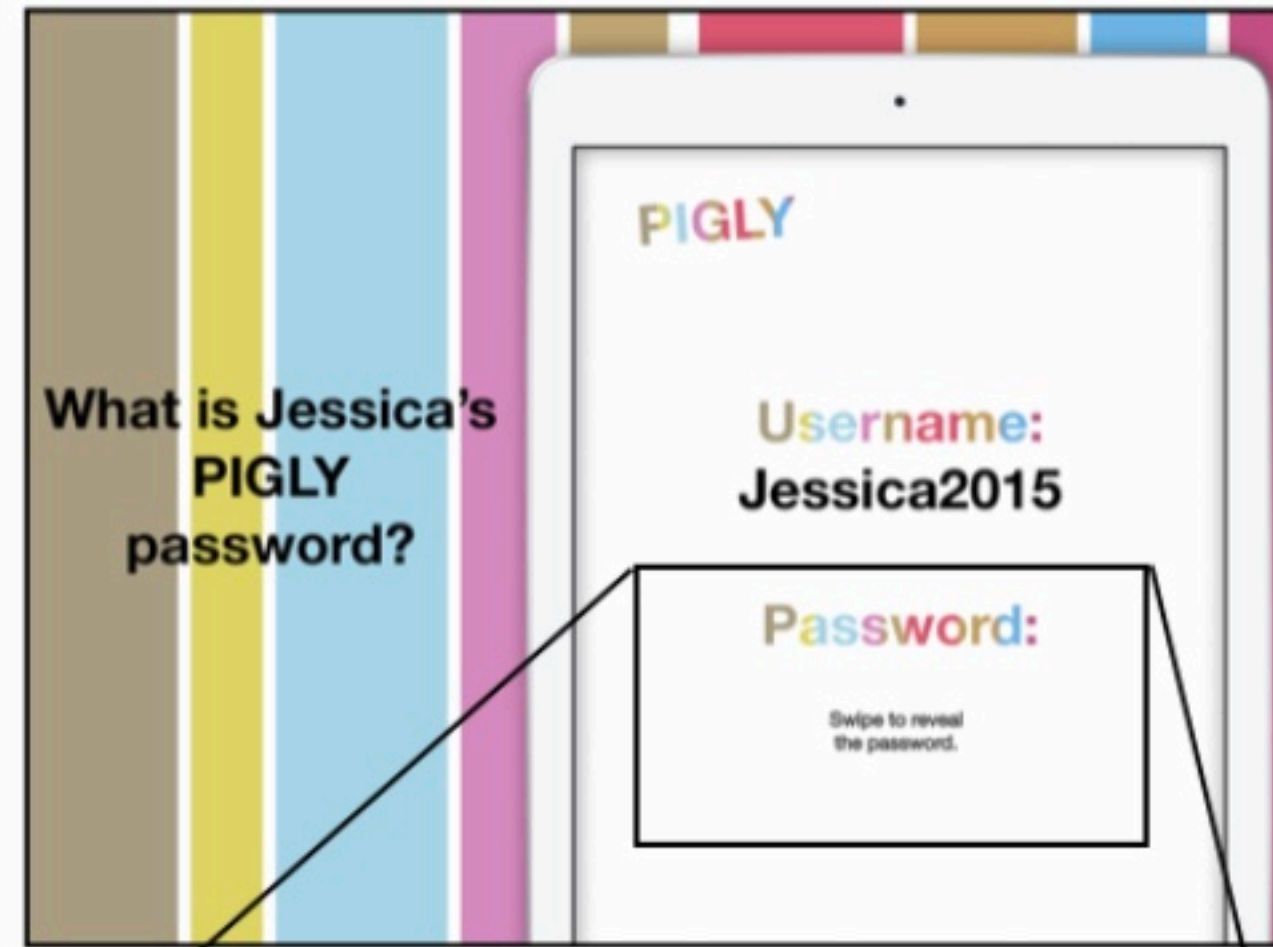


Take a look at each profile page then try to guess their password based on what the character likes a lot.



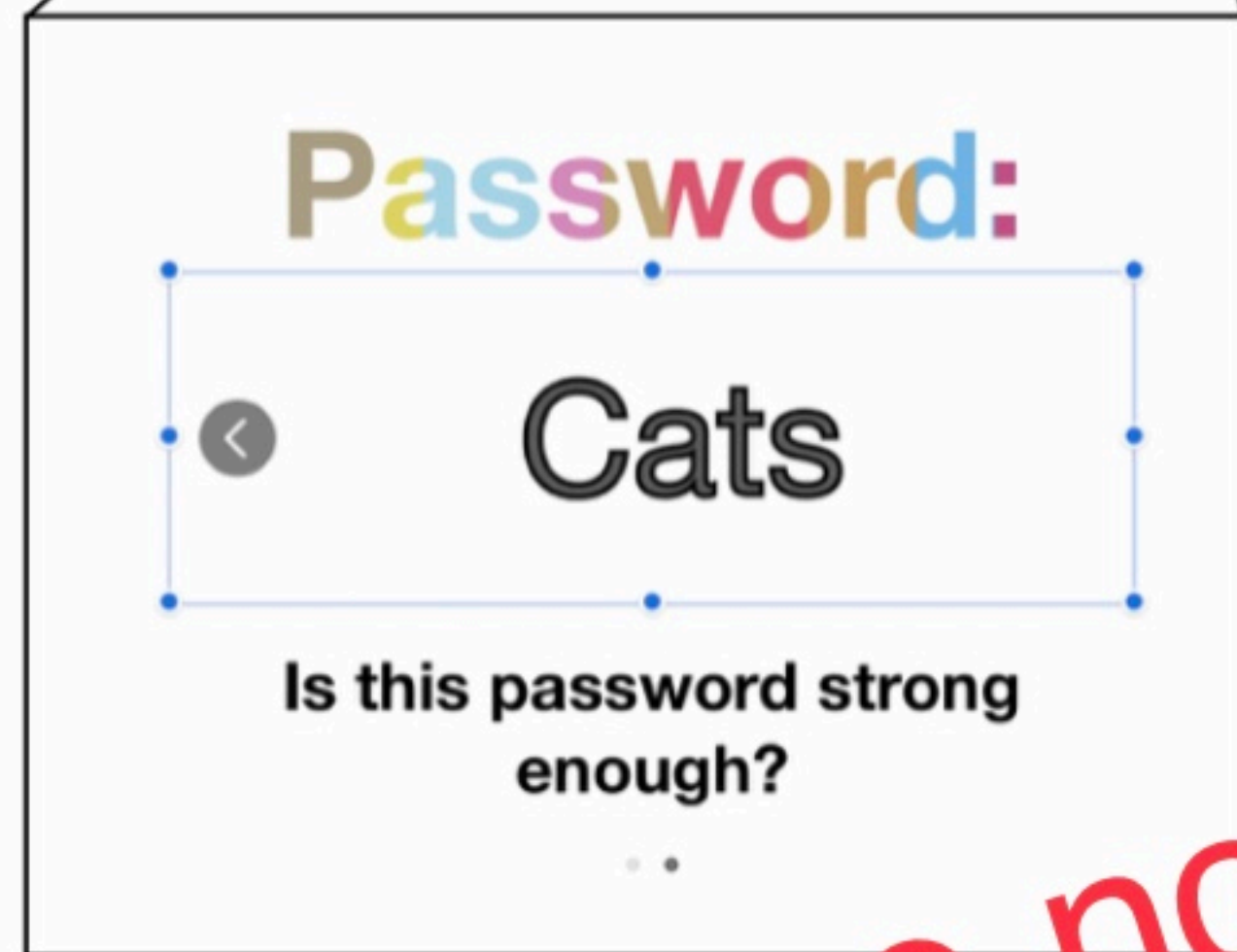
Are these passwords strong enough? No, because they are easy to guess!

Tap the arrow and the password will show.

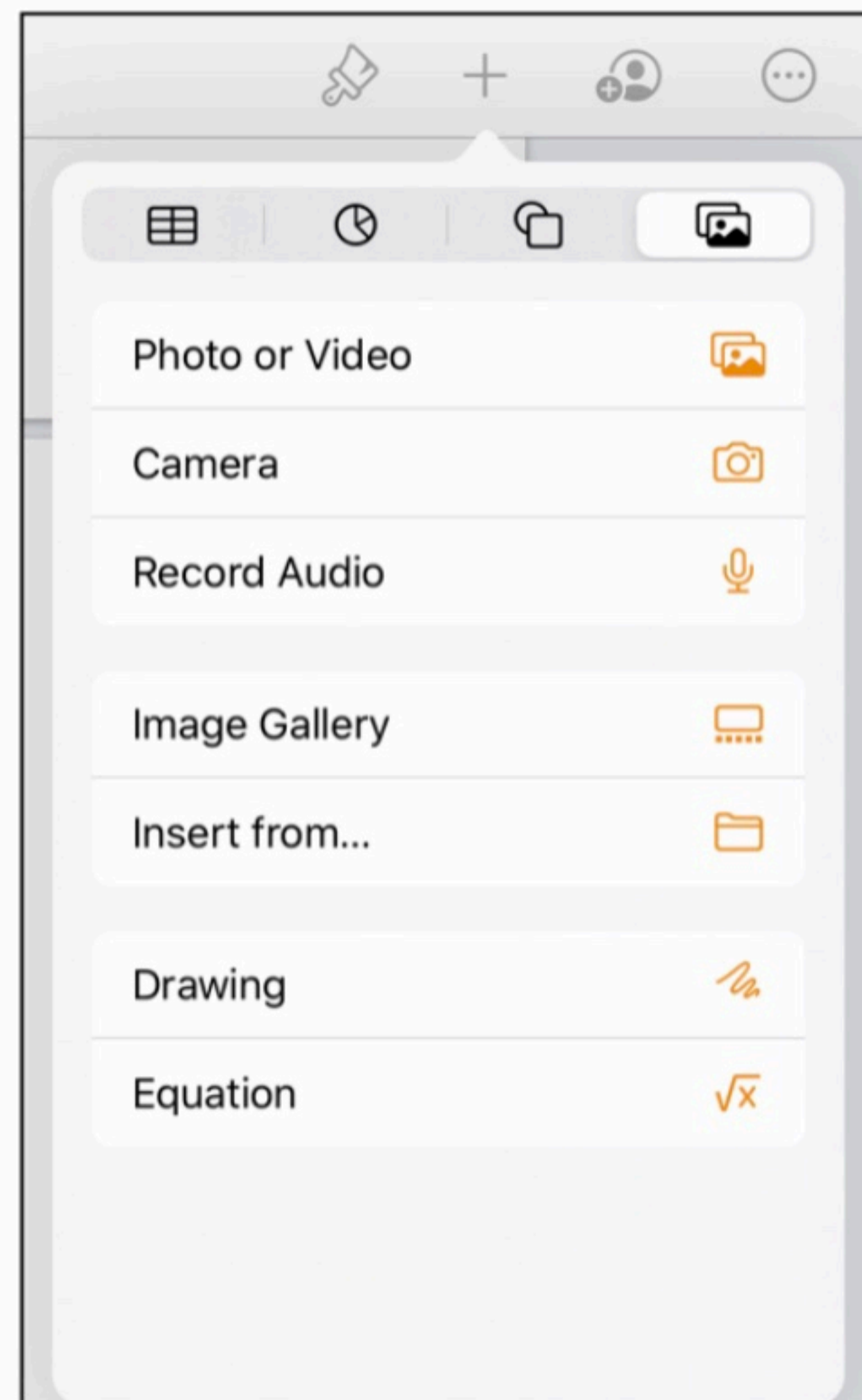
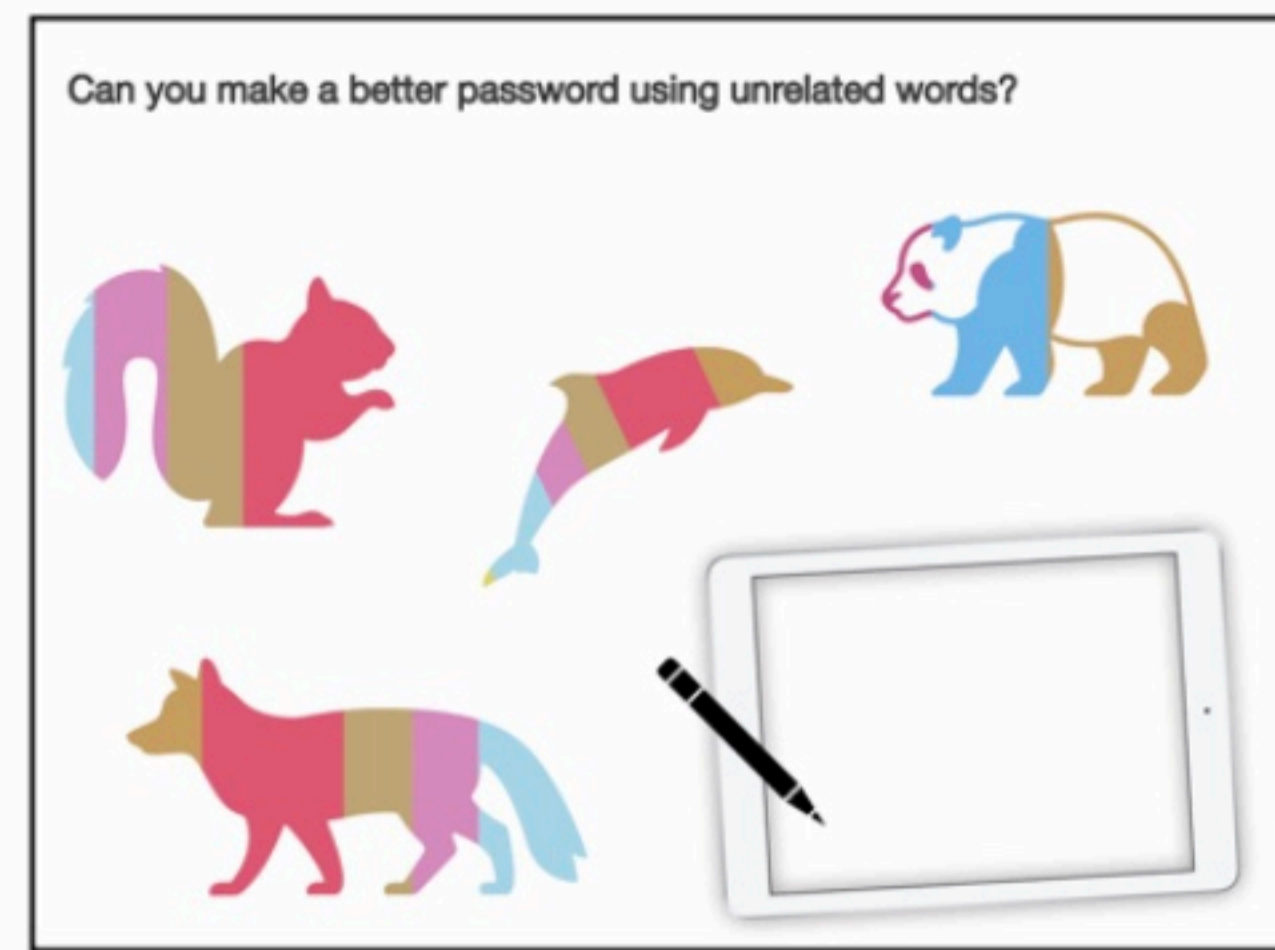

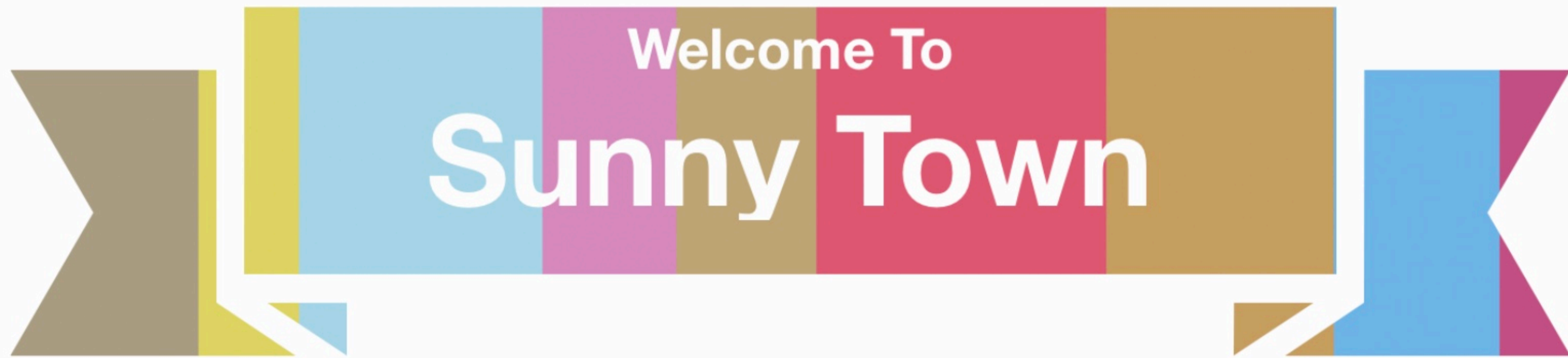
Children need to enter a new password using unrelated, random words.
